





The recommended reads for this newsletter are all picture books that have all been suggested by Miss Nevitt who loves a good picture book.

SPOTLIGHT ON VALUES: HONESTY

- Integrity/ being true to yourself
- Courage to tell the truth
- Responding to and growing own conscience
- Having the sensitivity to know how and when to speak the truth
- Sharing insightful understanding of possible consequence to not telling the truth
- Being honest about how you feel
- Being honest enough with yourself to accept constructive criticism.

NHS - Symptoms of coronavirus

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

Main symptoms:

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

What to do if you or your child has symptoms:

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
2. You and anyone you live with should stay at home and not have visitors until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.
3. Do NOT attend school but call us to let us know

Anyone in your support bubble should also stay at home if you have been in close contact with them since your symptoms started or during the 48 hours before they started.

If anyone in your household (people who live with you) is having a test or awaiting test results then your children should not attend school.
