

Focus on Reading: EYFS & KS1





SAFEGUARDING: ONLINE SAFETY

Hello everyone, Mr Harris here with my Online Safety section.

This week has been Anti- Bullying Week. We have done assemblies where we are reinforcing the messages about how our school approaches bullying. This includes knowing what steps to take if someone is being bullied, ensuring our pupils know what to do if they are being bullied, how to deal with anyone who bullies and that everyone should take bullying seriously because of the long-term impact it can have on friendships, self-esteem as well as emotional and mental health and wellbeing.

Of course, this is something that can also happen online. Please discuss with your child what to do if they experience online bullying or if they know of somebody that is being. We want our children at Paget to be as safe as possible online, and this is just another step in ensuring this.

FOCUS ON BRITISH VALUES: DEMOCRACY

“every voice matters”

Every October the government promotes 'National democracy week' and during this half term we will be particularly focusing on democracy within our school community.

Democracy is one of the fundamental British values that every school is expected to promote. The main principle of democracy is that people have the right to participate in decisions that affect their lives and is most obviously seen in general and local elections, where all adults have the right to vote for their chosen governmental representative.

It follows that in a healthy democratic society, all those who are involved in a school should also have a say in important decision that will affect their everyday lives. But what does this actually look like in a school? At Paget we work hard to ensure that our pupils feel they have a voice within school which is listened to and has an impact on their daily school life. This ranges from the simplest of things -such as ordering their choice of school dinner and voting how to spend their hard-earned Paget Pounds, to voting for their class representative on the School Council. Our school council is perhaps one of the clearest examples of democracy at work in Paget. Staff members will often join meetings to consult with the children over the purchase of playground equipment, ways to make lessons more enjoyable and memorable and the type of activities provided by after school clubs.

However, our pupils are not the only members of our school community whose voice we are keen to hear at Paget: parents also have a right to participate in decision making which will affect the education of their children:- voting for governors; attending workshops and informal coffee mornings; responding to questionnaires; and contributing to the development of school policies. Of course this is not an exhaustive list and we are keen to hear any ideas from parents of how we can continue to develop and grow as a democratic school, thus ensuring everyone's voice is heard.
