

SPOTLIGHT ON CURRICULUM: SCIENCE

Science at Paget supports our children to explore and understand aspects of the world around us. The children during their time here learn key skills to support them to develop a good knowledge of many aspects of the curriculum such as Living Things and Electricity as well as developing enquiry skills. A creative and hands on curriculum is at the heart of Science learning within school.

The journey to create enthusiastic Scientists starts in Foundation with developing fundamental language and investigation skills, creating awe and wonder for the children. This journey continues into Key Stage 1 where pupils continue to develop their questioning and investigation skills, further enhancing their natural curiosity into how things work and why.

By the time the children leave Year 6 at the end of Key Stage 2, the children are fully equipped with the knowledge and skills to continue their journey into the next level of learning at secondary school.


