Does your child watch livestreams?

What is livestreaming?

Livestreaming is when an individual broadcasts video live over the internet. People can watch livestreams from any device that is connected to the internet.

What are the risks?

There are risks associated with watching livestreams that you should be aware of. The main risk being that your child may see or hear something inappropriate as your child may come across themes or content that is not suitable for them. It is difficult to moderate live content as it is happening in real time.

How can I help my child?

All online platforms have an age rating, ensure your child only accesses platforms that are appropriate to their age. For example, TikTok has an age rating of 13.

For any platforms that your child uses, ensure appropriate parental controls and privacy settings are applied.

Take an interest in what your child is doing online and on a regular basis, ask your child to show you what they are accessing.

Ensure your child knows how to use any reporting/blocking tools on the app that they are using and as always please ensure that your child knows to talk to a trusted adult if they see anything that concerns them online.

SPOTLIGHT ON CURRICULUM: ART

Art at Paget

Just as the quote states, every child is an artist at Paget. Art brings out each child's creative side and allows them to express themselves. Furthermore, Art generates a collective spirit by understanding individual contributions can come together to make a masterpiece. This is demonstrated in Year 1:





On transition day in July, each child coloured in their own section of the rainbow. We then placed them all together to create a giant rainbow masterpiece! This was a great way for children to express their creative attributes but also (linking to PSHE) a way to feel connected to their new class.

British Values at Paget.

The British Values are promoted throughout school life and the use of the Jigsaw Learning Charter which is shared at the beginning of every PSHE lesson. The Learning Charter is child-centred and aims to encourage children to work together and follow a set of 'ground rules' to create a safe, positive learning environment.

Democracy is evident across all areas in school and within the PSHE programme. Children at Paget have lots of opportunities for their voices to be heard through whole class, group or paired discussions. We encourage children (and adults alike) to listen carefully to one another and respect the right of others whilst having opportunities to have their own opinions and voices heard. Throughout the school year, children will have opportunities to put their vote forward in various situations, such as, School Council, in-class monitors, etc.

The Rule of Law is evident in every part of school life. Children are taught the value, importance and reasoning behind why rules exist. There are lots of opportunities throughout all age groups to explore making positive choices as well as how <u>this balances</u> with consequences. Making positive behavioural choices is explored through class, partner and group discussions.

Individual Liberty at Paget is provided by a structured programme of personal development to nurture the 'whole child' and increase learning capacity, underpinned by mindfulness philosophy and practice. At Paget, we believe these opportunities are vital for children's development, understanding of themselves and others and increasing their capacity to learn. Children are provided with opportunities to make informed choices and feel comfortable expressing their views.

Mutual respect

One of the key aspects at Paget is how we enable and teach children to have respectful discussions on sensitive subjects. This ensures that children feel enabled to freely express their faith, feelings and values in an environment of mutual respect. Children are encouraged to develop their ability to listen to others respectfully, debate other people's views and consider ways that we can be accepting of those who may be different to ourselves.

Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs.

We are extremely lucky at Paget, as we have such a diverse and caring community. We encourage children to look at how we might differ in many ways, but that there are human and spiritual elements in us all where we can find a connection and empathy with each other, no matter how much the world might find difference a cause for conflict. We aim to go beyond 'tolerance' to help children 'celebrate difference', their own individuality and that of others.
