His name is Jet and he belongs to Mrs. Thomas.


He is a very friendly and cuddly labradoodle. He is a first cross (poodle and Labrador) and has a hypo-allergenic coat.

Mrs Spiers still managed to moan and suggest our team needs more fitness, but we got to the final whistle and on we go to the next round \heartsuit



Spotlight on Reading for Pleasure

Dear parents and carers,

Book Chat: Reading with your Child



What is book chat?

Book Chat is the informal interaction that accompanies quality reading to and with children, developing children's language and comprehension and nurturing a love of reading.

The films model this relaxed interaction through the use of open questions, comments and prompts to initiate Book Chat and enable you as adults and children to share the pleasure of reading together.

The films are based around three titles published on the Macmillan Children's Books list and their Two Hoots illustrated imprint. Each is aimed at a different age of child who will be engaging with the stories or poems.

Spotlight on Reading for Pleasure (Continued)



Research indicates that parents who regularly need with their children at home lay solid foundations for language and literacy development. It's a proclaus time for you both to relax, share your thoughts and feelings, have fun and chat together. Whilst sharing books, your child has your undivided attention, and the convertation, connection and enjoyment they experience is invaluable.

To promote children's pleasure in reading and factor the habit, we need to read to children and with them and to telk to them about books. These conveniations are crucial as they help children to engage and think deeply.

There are several ways to prompt book chat, these are our Top Tips.

Watch and listen carefully to follow their interests Observe and respond: Pay attention to what captures your child's attention and build on their interests, for example, 'Oh, you've gotted the...!'.

Leave pauses: So they can look closely and think, this will lead to comments on the pictures or questions. Respond to their lead and let the book chat flow.

Invite your child to get involved Pose questions: Open questions encourage thinking and discussion, such as, 'How do you think the boy is feeling?'. Try to avoid closed questions, such as 'What colour is that?'; these have a single answer and don't keep the conversation going.

Draw attention to illustrations: Encourage your child to notice details in the pictures and think what they might mean, for example, "Look! What's that hiding, what do you think it might be?".

Wonder and connect to your lives Ponder and wonder: Encourage your child to think about what might happen, using phrases such as, I wonder if whether /who/why/ whet ...

Make personal connections: Picture storybooks not only allow children to empathise with the experiences of fictional characters but enable them to make cause of events in their own lives. Talk about connections, for example, "That reminds me of when...".

Share your emotional responses! Comment on your feelings: By sharing your emotional response to a character or comething that's happened you ancourage your child to do the same, helping them engage and learn to express their emotions.

Keep it light and enjoyable! Your combined pleasure counts: Bring the story to life with facial expression, actions and sounds, encouraging your child to join in! Do offer information to help with unifamiliar words, such as That's the hencopy, it's where the hero live', but keep the focus on fun.

SPOTLIGHT ON CURRICULUM: Art

Art at Paget

Here at Paget, we believe that every child is an artist. Did you know that Art has several benefits for children? Including helping to develop fine motor skills, problem-solving skills, and social communication!



We follow a scheme called "Kapow" which emphasises children exploring a range of different artists, styles, and use of a variety

of materials. The skills that children learn in KS1, are then developed, and expanded in KS2.

As Art lead, I get the absolute pleasure of seeing the brilliant work that goes on in classes. I love it when children are so proud of their work and they bring it to show me!

Below are some of the amazing examples of the breadth at which Art is taught at Paget:







In Spring 1, Year 6 have a great topic which focuses on making their voices heard. This comprises of a combination of street art, as well as Mayan art. Look how brilliant all their clay heads turned out!



Year 2 also completed a topic looking at the art of illustrations and had to create their own characters in a story. They explored the work of Quentin Blake and generated some super sketches!

Finally, Year 1 have just begun their topic of sculptures of living things. Our first lesson comprised of sketching snail shells from observations and then using modelling clay to create our own snail sculptures. We worked on the skill of etchings to add the detail. Look how fantastic we are!
