

# Fortnite Battle Royale

#### What is Fortnite?

There are different versions of Fortnite, including Battle Royale, which is free to play (although in-app purchases are available). In Battle Royale up to one hundred players compete against each other.

### What do I need to be aware of?

- Chatting to strangers and inappropriate language: Fortnite contains voice and text chat. Due to the nature of the game, your child may be chatting to strangers and may hear inappropriate language. Ensure your child knows how to report players for any inappropriate behaviour.
- In app purchases: All users can purchase V-Bucks directly through the game so make sure you don't store your card details within the game/device and restrict purchases.


### Parental Controls

Fortnite includes several parental controls to help you make it a safer environment for your child including disabling voice chat, filtering language and setting privacy settings. Also, remember to set up ageappropriate parental controls on the device your child is playing on.



## SPORTS REPORT 1: Football

#### Short Heath oust Paget in seven-goal battle

#### Short Heath 5 Paget 2

A titanic tussle was both forecasted and expected as two heavyweights and age-old rivals, Short Heath and Paget, went head-to-head in La Liga on Tuesday afternoon at the AVFC Dome. As a spectacle, the game lived up to its billing, especially in a tight first half but it was Short Heath who would emerge victorious after an impressive second half display.

The game exploded into life as after just 90 seconds, Paget were ahead through a brilliantly taken goal from Milad. A long goal kick was mis-judged by a Short Heath defender and Paget's striker then composed himself before thumping home from just outside the penalty area. The game then fizzed along with slick passing moves from either side creating chances but neither side was able to snaffle any up. That was until midway through the first half. Short Heath's impressive ball-carrying defender found himself with room to manoeuvre some fifteen yards out and then struck a vicious, dipping shot beyond Paget's keeper and into the far corner of the net. The game then settled down with both sides looking to prize each other open once more but neither were able to add to their tally – 1-1 at the break.

Within three minutes of the restart the destiny of this fixture had swung the way of Short Heath. The ESPSFA Trophy winners struck three times without reply: the first a brilliant solo effort from their slaloming midfielder, the second another superb strike from outside the penalty box from the same defender who had levelled earlier and the third after Paget's keeper failed to deal with a low strike. At 4-1, Short Heath then dictated the play, but Paget battled on valiantly and still mounted a foray or two into enemy territory.

However, the three points were sealed five minutes from time when Short Heath's classy midfielder chasséed his way through a tiring Paget defence to slot home number five. Paget still pressed on through and were rewarded ninety seconds from time with a well-taken goal. A smart diving save from Short Heath's number one diverted the ball away from goal but into the path of a an on-running Paget striker who from eight yards, smashed into the unguarded net.

The win takes Short Heath level on points with leaders Mapledene – 'dene stay top on goal difference but have played a game more. Paget remain in third place and though they are six points behind the front-runners, they have a game in hand on Short Heath and two on Mapledene.
